String Instrument Sizing Self-Measuring

Measuring String Instruments: The measurements below are a good starting point but think of string instruments like bicycles. It is much better to be on one that is slightly too small than one that is too big. If you are on the edge, ALWAYS go DOWN to the next size lower.

Size Exceptions

Beginning 6th grade students will be limited to the size of certain instruments (Viola and Double Bass) when first starting. This is based on personal teaching experience, the challenges due to the size of specific instruments for beginning players, and the level of consistent success from students.

Violin- fractional sizes from ¼ to 4/4 (full)

*Regardless of measurements, beginning 6th grade viola students will not be allowed to start on a 15-inch or larger instrument

Double Bass- fractional sizes from ¼ to 4/4 (full)

*Regardless of measurements, beginning 6th Grade Double Bass players will start on ¼ or ½ size double bass
