Students must meet mastery performance standards, demonstrate proper classroom behavior, and attend the required rehearsals/performances to maintain their enrollment in the Chamber Orchestra classes during the current school year.

Chamber Orchestra	Performance Expectations		
Expectations	Chamber Orchestra students are expected to perform at the high school level of focus and awareness towards		
	musical precision, intonation, technique, and expression both as an individual and as an ensemble group. It is		
	essential (and strongly encouraged) that students ask for help either from Mr. Liu or their private lesson teacher.		
	Attendance Expectations		
	All Chamber Orchestra students are required to perform the major concerts; Fall Arts Festival, Winter Concert,		
	Performance Evaluations, and Spring Concerts. Students in Chamber Orchestra may have additional performances		
	during and outside of school days. Due to the technical and musical complexities of the pieces, it is required for		
	Chamber Orchestra students to attend outside of class rehearsals regardless of individual performance mastery in		
	the music. Students and parents will be given advance notice of required, additional concert performances and		
	rehearsals. Please notify Mr. Liu, far in advance, of any significant conflicts. Required Performances and Morning		
	rehearsals are graded.

	individual or group demonstrations, and quizzes.		
	Practice (10%): An assignment that is intended to allow students to make mistakes as they practice skills recently
