	attend the required rehearsals/performances to maintain their enrollment in the Chamber Orchestra classes during the		
	current school year.

Chamber Orchestra	Performance Expectations		
Expectations	Chamber Orchestra students are expected to perform at the high school level of focus and awareness towards musical		
	precision, intonation, technique, and expression both as an individual and as an ensemble group. It is essential (and		
	strongly encouraged) that students ask for help either from Mr. Liu or their private lesson teacher.		
	Attendance Expectations		
	All Chamber Orchestra students are required to perform the major concerts; Fall Arts Festival, Winter Concert,		
	Performance Evaluations, and Spring Concerts. Students in Chamber Orchestra may have additional performances during		
	and outside of school days. Due to the technical and musical complexities of the pieces, it is required for Chamber		
	Orchestra students to attend outside of class rehearsals regardless of individual performance mastery in the music.		
	Students and parents will be given advance notice of required, additional concert performances and rehearsals. Please		
	notify Mr. Liu, far in advance, of any significant conflicts. Required Performances and Morning rehearsals are graded.

Grading Categories	Major (50%): An assignment that is cumulative in nature, representing multiple standards and skills. Assignments in this		
	category may include Large Group Performance Evaluation, Performance-Based Assessments (PBAs), concerts, tests, and		
	projects.		
	Minor (40%): An assignment that measures mastery of a single skill or learning target. Assignments in this category may		
	include Performance-Based Assessments focused on one skill or learning target, rhythmic dictation, short individual or		
	group demonstrations, and quizzes.		
	Practice (10%): An assignment that is intended to allow students to make mistakes as they practice skills recently		
	learned in class. Assignments in this category may include progress checks, class participation, and exit tickets.		
Classwork/Homework	Classwork and/or homework will be assigned daily. Students are expected to show evidence demonstrating their

Attendance &	Regular attendance in this class is essential for each student to be successful.		
Make-Up Work	Upon returning to school, students will have an equal number of days as they were absent to complete any		
	late/missing assignment, assessment, and/or task(s) for full credit.

	*All Orchestra students are required to attend and perform at Major Concerts listed in the Orchestra Calendar. These		
	concert performances are graded as a Major Grade.		

Recovery Policy	Students will be given the opportunity to recover all major assessments if they score below a 75% on the assessment. Students are limited to one recovery attempt per major assessment that meets the threshold for recovery. Recovery of a major assessment should occur before the next major is given. Eligible students can earn a replacement grade that is no higher than 75%. If the recovery grade is below the original score, the original score should stand in the grade book.
